# CAPE TOWN'S COLLEGE OF MAGIC: A ONE-OF-A-KIND MAGIC SCHOOL



You can't wave a wand and make intolerance, hardship and violence disappear. But you can use magic to try. We learned that after visiting a remarkable school in Cape Town, South Africa. It's called the College of Magic. While it's not an accredited institution, it is a real-life Hogwarts, a school filled with students ranging in age from 10 to 18, and more importantly, reflecting South Africa, they come from privilege and poverty.

Pick a canard, any canard - sleight of hand; juggling; ventriloquism; card tricks — you can learn it all at the College of Magic. But what the school really teaches is also the great superpower of magic itself: rethinking the limits of possibility.


