

#### AL BAKER'S PET HAT TRICK.

For the first time in print I am going to describe a fake h hat I have used for many years. It is a valuable accessor and will be found very useful for many other effects that the performer will think of.

The hat is to be made from a coft felt one and two are scenary in the preparation. The crown is cut from one and to that it can be inserted into the good hat and the hard strend down over it. The performer asks for the loan of three one-dollar bills. The spectators are asked to fold them up reveral times each way into a flat bundle. The hat is on table with the immer pocket open as illustrated. At the start the performer has in the hat proper three bills, the numbers of which he has memorized

## LAST MEETING SYNOPSIS | CARL LOUD

Our guest lecturer for the evening was a magician from the north of Spain, Marcos Waldemar who is an illusionist and creator of magic and magic effects. He began by performing a few card tricks with the assistance of club members. One trick in particular was most impressive was where Marcos tore several playing cards in half, placed the halves in two separate piles, had an assistant pick one of the halves and then he produced the matching half perfectly by a series of magical moves and manipulations.

Another was where he had a card selected, signed placed on top of the deck and with the performance of the best Top Change ever showed that two large black circles

were drawn over the two circles on the back of the iconic Bicycle playing cards. Then, the two circles were shown linked together! Marcos then turned the selected card over showing that it was the original card signed by the spectator.

He then taught us how he, and we can perform the same move. After a brief intermission, Marcos discussed the use of gimmicks. One that has been around for some time, the Thumb-Tip Writer and two of his own creations, The Fly and Crush Balls. The Fly is a card predicting insect that walks across a fanned deck and stops on the spectator's chosen card. Crush Balls are small beads used to freshen one's breath. They give off an aromatic scent which Marcos identifies when held under a spectator's nose. Overall, it was an enjoyable night!




