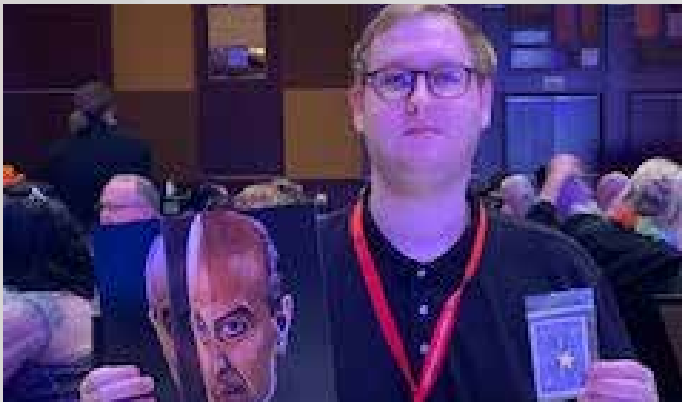
Highview Arts Center
