It's Magic! Marks a Milestone!

Our annual fundraising show *It's Magic!* marks a milestone this year. Recently we discovered that the shows began in 1988. In an LMC Bulletin from 1992, Secretary Earl Bullard mentions that our annual show reached a milestone in attendance with 1500 seats sold. He stated "not bad for our 4th year!" so that means our annual shows began in 1988 and this marks 30 years of doing a big fundraising show.

The performance venue has changed over the years. For many years we performed at Iroquois Amphitheater as *Magic Under the Stars*. Then we moved to the Ursuline Arts Center and became *It's Magic!* No matter what the show is called or the venue where it is performed, this year marks our 30th Anniversary show!

Wouldn't it be great to sell out the Ursuline Arts Center? Ursuline Arts Center has 507 seats, plus wheel-chair seating. There are 403 seats on the first floor and 104 in the balcony. If we sold 1500 seats in 1992 - surely we can sell 500 in 2018.

He does it by showing you how to build a real, heart felt connection with your audience, sharing what he believes magic really is, why you even do magic, and gives you the secrets that will make your magic last well beyond the short time you spend with your audience.

Magic from the pages of *The Magic SYMbol*

In February of 2013, our issue was 40 tricks you can do with cards. All of the effects were self working or easy to do. So here are a couple of the 40 Tricks with Cards.

Odd and Even

Secretly discard all of the court cards and divide the remainder of the deck into two parts, the odd cards in one pile and the even cards in another.

Hand the two halves to two different people and have them each select a card. The spectators then place their selected card in the other person's packet. Upon receiving the cards back, it is easy to find the selected cards because one will be the odd card in the even half, the other will be the even card in the odd half.

10-20 Force

Place the card to be forced 9th from the top of the deck. Ask a spectator to name any number between 10 and 20, Add the two digits of the named number, then subtract the chosen number from the total. Count down to the card at that number. Example: if the chosen number is 15, 1 + 5 = 6. 15 - 6 = 9. The total will always be 9.
