

(There was a nasty rumor that we don't like card tricks going around). And feel free to publish the graphic on your social if you care to. That would be terrific.

And send us your tricks too.

People do sneak back on once or twice in a while, as you know!

The big announcement is coming, I feel it. But this casting call goes out now, in anticipation of notable things to announce in the near future. ;-)

For anyone who does not know or cares to ask, here's this:

These are the submission guidelines for Fool Us.

Submission guidelines:

- Please submit a recording of your routine as you would perform it on our show. Unlisted links to vimeo or youtube are preferred. Download links do not get our first attention.
- We don't require a live audience or a stage, but record the video as if you were performing in front of Penn and Teller / or via remote to our studio.
- Professional video is not necessary. Cell phone video is fine as long as the audio is intelligible.
- We love original magical acts with novel and clever methods and tricks we may know but with a new presentation and a twist.
- Routines should be 3-5 minutes in length.
- Videos should be unedited.
- Please make sure we can see your face in the video, even for close up routines.
- For close up/card tricks, be sure the camera is close enough to read the cards.
- Deadline for this coming season is TBD.
- We are happy to help develop tricks that show a lot of promise but are not quite "there."
